The parking is scarce and the streets in the historic centre narrow, so we advise you to follow your GPS to the nearest parking and leave your car there until the end of your stay.

Discover the oldest active palace of Spain

Outside, the Fuente de Mercurio will catch your eye and afterwards, if you continue along the walls you will enjoy an amazing view above the garden, one of the most amazing features of this palace.

Visit one of the biggest cathedrals in the world and go up the Giralda

Even if the queue looks big, the entrance to the Cathedral of Seville is usually fast and soon you will be inside. Enjoy the street acts and animation while you wait. Once there, you must go up to the Giralda tower: the view is breath taking and the stairs were replaced for a ramp to allow everyone to go up.
